This MSc is taught by members of the Centre for Culture and Evolution, within the Psychology Division of Brunel University London. As globally renowned researchers in the fields of cross-cultural psychology, evolutionary psychology, and cultural evolution, they'll show you how *any* topic in psychology – from relationships and mating, to social conflict and cooperation, to moral, political, and religious beliefs – can be approached from these perspectives. As a student in this course (one year full-time, or two years part-time), you'll develop expertise in these approaches, and then conduct an original research project on the topic that interests you the most.

You'll gain cognitive, analytical, and research skills that will enhance your employability in careers related to global and public health, international agencies including governmental and nongovernmental research institutes, creative industries like advertising and market research, international business, and intercultural communication. This degree also provides an ideal foundation for a PhD in fields such as cross-cultural psychology, cultural evolution, evolutionary psychology, anthropology, behavioural ecology, sociology, and multicultural counselling.
