Your local hosts and academic planners are making plans to welcome scholars across the globe to Boston in July! Submission decisions for IARR Boston 2024 were emailed on February 7, but *you have another chance to submit to be part of this incredible conference*. Details below.

The IARR International Conference in Boston, MA, USA will be held on July 5-9, 2024. Our opening reception and keynote will be on July 5 with full conference days on July 6 through July 8 (with the dance on July 7). We will offer add-on excursion options for July 9. Those dates leave the opportunity for you to add-on to your time and enjoy the Boston Pops Fourth of July fireworks celebration or explore Cape Cod or other New England destinations.

Submission for Late-Breaking Research Posters: Do you have exciting new work that you want to share at IARR but missed the deadline? Great news! Submissions for late-breaking research posters will be accepted until **April 15, 2024**, and submission decisions will be emailed in late April 2024.

Submissions are invited on topics relevant to the research, teaching, and practice of social and personal relationships. Submitters will be required to submit two abstracts: (a) a short abstract (100 words or less to appear in the conference program), and (b) a long abstract (350 words or less to be reviewed). Priority for poster acceptance will be given to projects with data collection completed before submission. Authors of accepted posters are expected to register for the conference and to travel to Boston to present their work in person.
